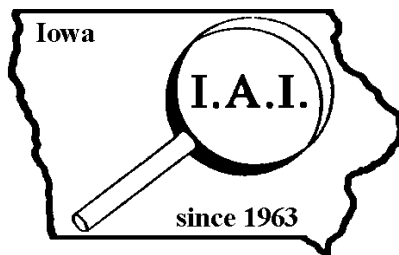

Digital Photography Students:

More and more law enforcement agencies in the state are embracing digital photography. The instructors involved with the Crime Scene School have recognized this, and are well prepared to meet the issues involved with the digital era.

If you will be bringing a digital camera to class, you will still need to bring a "35mm format" digital camera, with adjustable f/stops and shutter speeds. You will also have to bring a minimum of three media cards.

Point-and-shoot cameras, whether in film or digital format are discouraged. If you bring a camera such as this to class, you will be unable to complete sophisticated photo exercises.
